Mission

New Concepts for Living (NCFL) improves the lives of adults with special needs by creating an environment where they can thrive.



Who We Are

NCFL is a community-based not-for-profit dedicated to serving and empowering individuals with special needs (intellectual and developmental disabilities) while giving desperately needed respite to their families.

NCFL was formed in 1981 by a group of parents with developmentally disabled children who were transitioning into adulthood. Recognizing the lack of services and day programs for adults with special needs, NCFL was created to ensure that this demographic had access to essential enrichment programs and services enabling them to thrive.

NCFL offers comprehensive support for all participants, including housing, day programs, and therapeutic services, all in a nurturing environment. Our array of programs and services not only fosters the development of social skills and intellectual growth, but also empowers individuals to realize their fullest potential.

NCFL operates 17 Community Residences (group homes) and an Achievement Center (day program) in Rochelle Park, NJ. All of our Community Residences have direct support professionals on site 24/7, providing our participants with around-the-clock care.

NCFL'S TIMELINE

1981-1985
Founded

NCFL is founded in 1981 by several parents of children with special needs who are transitioning into adulthood.

The first Community Residence (group home) is opened in Hillsdale, NJ in 1985. This home remains open today.

1990-1996

NCFL expands the number of Community Residences with the opening of homes in Teaneck, Park Ridge, River Vale and River Edge.

1999-2012

NCFL moves their Achievement Center to a larger space in Rochelle Park to accommodate the rise in participants.

In response to a greater demand for Community Residences, NCFL opens homes in Clifton, Garfield, and Emerson.

2016-2020

NCFL opens Community Residences in Haledon, Northvale and two in Mahwah.

Recognizing the desperate need for housing for adults with special needs requiring 24/7 medical support, NCFL acquires four lots for the purpose of building Medically Supportive Residences.

2021 - 2023

NCFL opens Medically Supportive Residences in River Vale and two in Old Tappan.

Construction begins on two more Medically Supportive Residences.

NCFL owns and operates 17 Residences with plans to open five additional homes in 2024.

PRESENT

Construction is under way for an 81,000 sq ft state-of-the-art Achievement Center in Paramus, NJ. The construction of this much larger Center is due to the extremely high demand for our day program and therapeutic services. NCFL's waiting list currently stands at approximately 300 individuals and our goal is to accommodate all those seeking our services.



STATEMENT OF NEED

Over the last 42 years, NCFL's growth and unwavering dedication have positioned us as the leading agency providing compassionate and comprehensive care for adults with special needs.

The Achievement Center at NCFL provides essential programs and services that adults with special needs rely on for a fulfilling life. Our day program enables participants to enhance and develop their skill set, to be more independent, to participate in group activities, and to engage with the community.

As children with special needs transition into adulthood, families seek comprehensive day programs that can fill their days with valuable enrichment activities. Unfortunately, many agencies offering such services fall short of providing the level of care that NCFL offers or have long waiting lists. NCFL alone has a waiting list of approximately 300 individuals and growing.

The high demand for our services, coupled with the need for a significantly larger staff to accommodate the increase in participants, led NCFL to search for a more spacious facility to support and sustain this remarkable growth.



There are significant benefits for adults with disabilities who participate in a day program, including improved mental and emotional well-being, the opportunity to build relationships, enhanced independence, access to expanded disability support and resources, and community inclusion. Engagement in a day program has proven to reduce anxiety, depression, and loneliness. It also offers desperately needed respite for caretakers, allowing them to work and attend to their own needs. NCFL's day program focuses on enriching participants' lives while giving peace of mind to their loved ones.

Having outgrown our Rochelle Park Achievement Center, NCFL responded to the need for a larger space by purchasing a significantly larger facility (81,000 square feet) on Route 17 in Paramus, NJ. Our new Achievement Center is being custom-built, incorporating unique design enhancements tailored to the needs of our population, with plans for on-site physical, occupational, behavioral, and speech therapy. It will also include programs and dedicated spaces highlighting prevocational skills to assist those able to work in the community. This new space will increase our ability to serve adults with special needs more than three-fold.

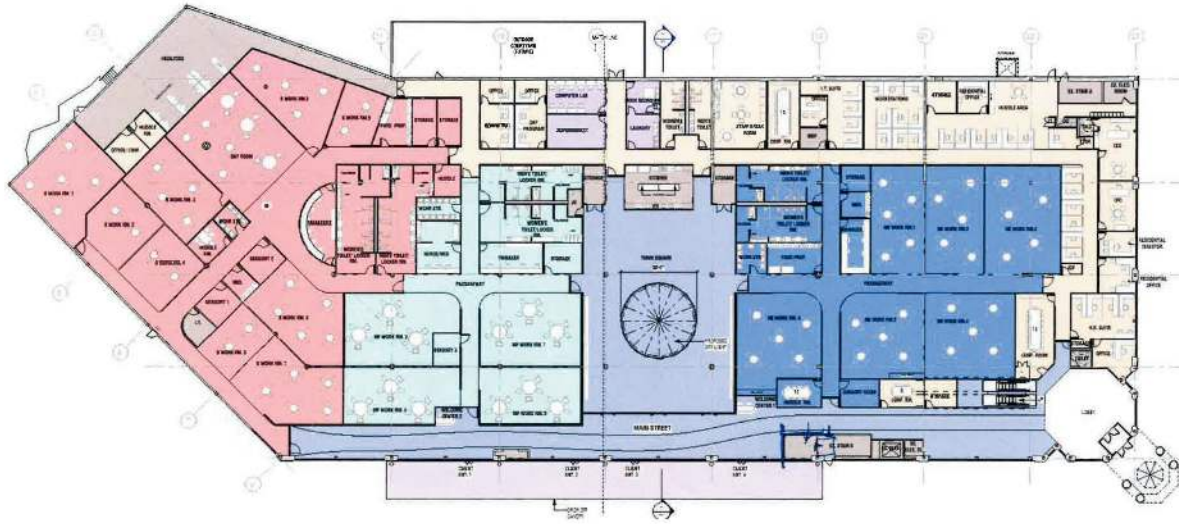
When completed in the Spring of 2024, NCFL's new Achievement Center will be the only one of its kind in the nation and serve as a model for all others in the field to follow.

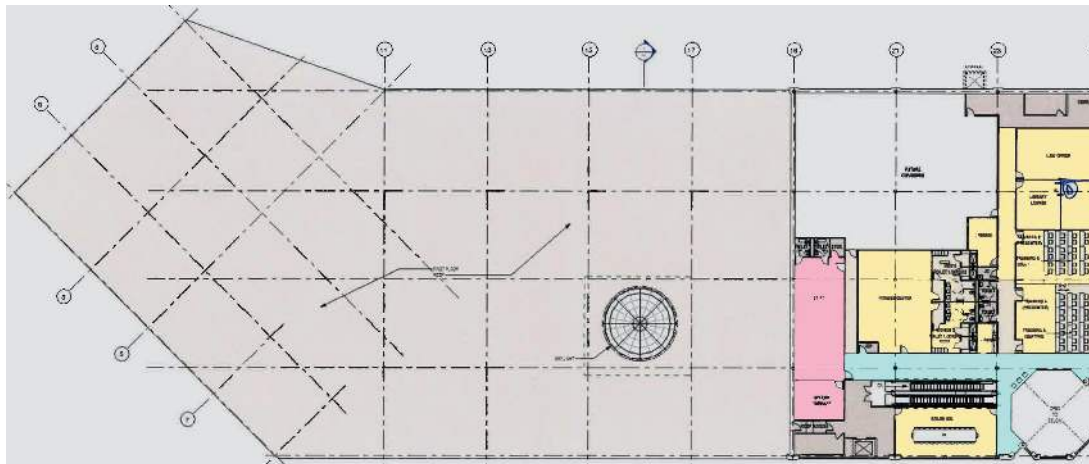

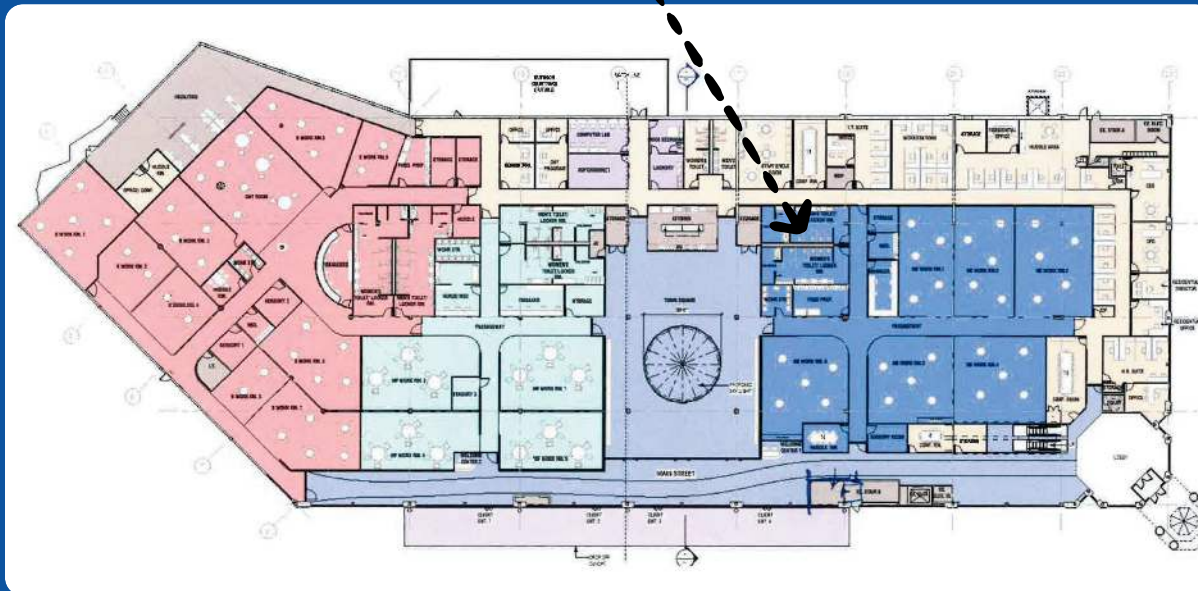

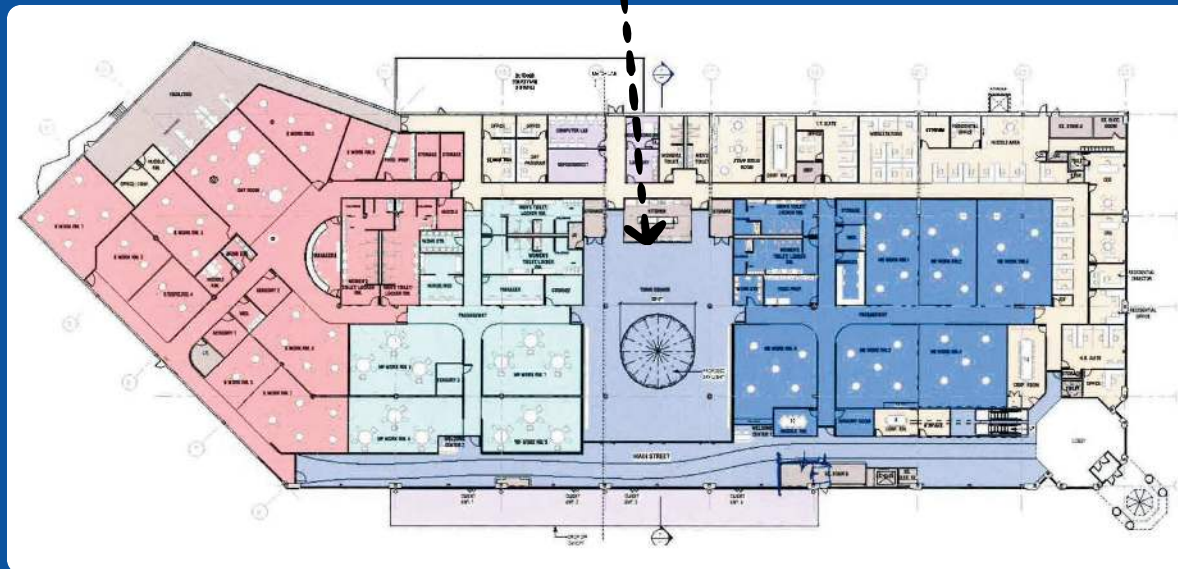

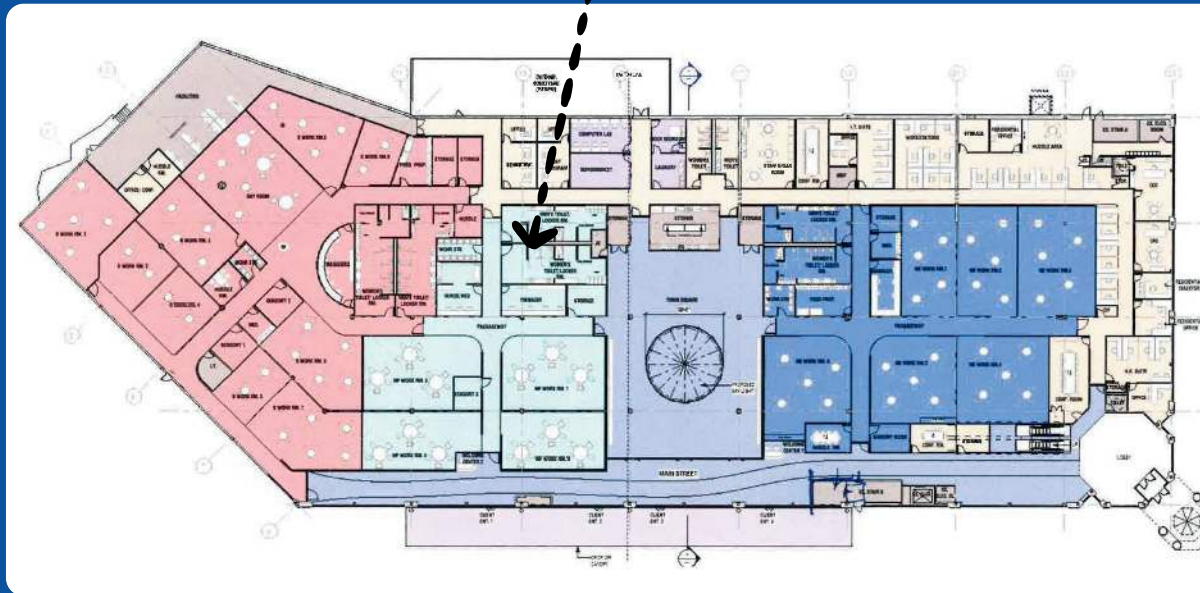
