"Town, NCFL open two special-needs residences

OF PASCACK PRESS RIVER VALE

Two new community residences for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) were the setting for cheers at a ribbon-cutting on Friday, Sept. 12, at 49 Greenhalph Lane.

New Concepts for Living CEO Steve Setteducati, River Vale Borough Administrator Gennaro Rotella, and Mayor Mark Bromberg cut the ribbon at 10:30 a.m., leading to tours, refreshments, and presentations to 2 p.m.

The homes were developed by NCFL on Township-donated land as part of River Vale's affordable-housing efforts.

The Joint Planning Board's July 17, 2024 resolution granted preliminary and final major subdivision approval with bulk vari-

Bromberg spoke warmly about the town's partnership with New Concepts for Living as a "win-win."

According to the Planning Board's resolution, the site was subdivided to create two communityresidences, each designed for four residents (eight total). A 30year deed restriction limits the use to low-income community residences for developmentally disabled adults: if NCFL defaults. title reverts to the Township.

The board noted the project advances River Vale's affordable housing obligations under its settlement and the Mount Laurel doctrine and characterized this housing type as inherently beneficial under New Jersey law and consistent with the Township Master Plan. The location sits by munici-
